Bruce Johnson, Vice President for the Air Traffic Organization's Terminal Services, is responsible for the delivery of terminal services to the customer and implementing new technology to support all terminal operations.

Johnson joined the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in 1974, beginning his career as an air traffic control specialist at the Albuquerque Air Route Traffic Control Center. He later moved to Fort Worth Center, where he became an area supervisor. Johnson held specialist positions in the Southwest Region Air Traffic Division, culminating his field career as Air Traffic Manager of the Houston Air Route Traffic Control Center.

Johnson also served as Assistant Air Traffic Division Manager in the Great Lakes Region. In addition, he was the Air Traffic Division Manager at the FAA's Northwest Mountain Region where he provided oversight of air traffic policies and operations in seven states.

Most recently, Johnson was the FAA's Director of Air Traffic Service where he was responsible for managing the controller workforce and more than 600 air traffic control facilities.

A graduate of Northeastern State College in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, Johnson holds a bachelor's of science degree in education.
